Magistrate Peter Dotchin

Peter Dotchin was appointed as a Magistrate in June 2010 and is now sitting full time in the Children's Court of Victoria. Peter has an extensive history of working with the Children's, Magistrates' and County Courts of Victoria. Peter has worked with the Victorian Legal Aid Commission, specialising in Criminal and Children's Court law, and more recently in private practice as a solicitor advocate. Ms. Robyn Miller
