Carer reference guide: Frequently asked questions

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Introduction

This reference guide was created by the North Division Carer Advisory Group, to help foster and kinship carers quickly locate information regarding common questions that may arise during their experience caring for children and young people in out-of-home care. The guide utilises internet hyperlinks due to the dynamic nature of the information provided and the consequent possibility that policy changes or new information will be unreflected in hard copy documentation. The guide is current as at March 2017 and will be updated annually to reflect any changes to the information provided.  - Child Protection will advise the carer of the child's Aboriginality at the time of placement.
 - Current Child Protection practice advice requires both the Aboriginal child and their carer to have a copy of the child's Cultural Support Plan, and these should be provided to the carer.
 - Carers without copies of the child's Cultural Support Plan can obtain these from the Care Team.

Reassessment of child's funding level
